## Anna Perry, GWAAC CEO

## Professor Jonathan Benger OBE

Jonathan, or JB as he is known, was instrumental in the setup of GWAAC, acting as our first medical advisor. Jonathan still completes shifts with us as a Critical Care Doctor, and is also a Trustee of the charity.

As CMO for NHS digital he has overseen NHS Pathways, NHS111 online, the NHS.UK website and the NHS app, for which he received an OBE in the 2022 New Years Honours list.



## Dr Phil Cowburn MBE, Critical Care Doctor

Phil qualified as a Doctor nearly 30 years ago, and has been a Consultant in Emergency Medicine at the BRI since 2008. Phil is one of GWAAC's founding doctors.

Phil is also South Western Ambulance NHS Foundation Trust (SWAST)'s Acute Care Medical Director, Medical Advisor at the National Ambulance Resilience Unit, Trauma Consultant at Southmead, and Medical Advisor to specialist police units in Avon & Somerset and Gloucestershire. His special interests are major trauma, major incident response and triage and complex incident response, particularly response to terrorist incidents.



## Captain Jim Green, Regional Managing Pilot (South)

Jim has been working for GWAAC since 2014. Employed by our helicopter supplier Babcock, he is also their Regional Managing Pilot (south).

Jim is civilian trained, having begun his career in New Zealand. He has worked the oil rigs and been an instructor training military and police pilots.





### **Captain Rich MacLaughlin, Pilot**

Rich re-joined GWAAC in 2023 as one of the charity's permanent pilots following a period serving as a touring pilot. Before that, he was one of GWAAC's pilots for six years.

He previously worked as a pilot in the Royal Navy for 16 years flying 'Sea Kings' and 'Squirrels'. At the end of his commission, Rich made the move into HEMS by working for another air ambulance for a couple of years. In 2014, he began working for GWAAC as a HEMS pilot.

### **Dr Andy Lockyer, Medical Director and Critical Care Doctor**

Dr Andy has been GWAAC's Medical Director since July 2023 and is a long-standing Critical Care Doctor for the charity. He qualified as a Critical Care Doctor in 2017 and has been a Consultant in Emergency Medicine at the Bristol Royal Infirmary since 2018, where he is the Clinical Lead for public health, major trauma, education, and global health. He is trustee and founder of a separate charity, Dharura, to develop emergency care through global partnerships, including pre-hospital care.



### **Vicki Brown, Advanced Practitioner in Critical Care**

Vicki Brown, the South West's first Advanced Practitioner in Critical Care, joined the ambulance service in 2002, and GWAAC in 2012. Vicki specialises in breaking down barriers, achieving many firsts for her profession and winning a national award for her achievements.

Recently, Vicki became the first person from a purely paramedic background on the Faculty of Pre-Hospital Care register for Consultant Practitioners in Pre-Hospital Medicine.



### **Tim Ross-Smith, Operations Officer**

In October 2023, Tim Ross-Smith joined GWAAC as the new Operations Officer. Tim is the line manager for the Advanced Practitioners and Specialist Paramedics in Critical Care and is also responsible for the day-to-day running of the airbase alongside GWAAC's Operations Manager.

Tim joined Avon Ambulance in the Patient Control Room in 2004 and has held various roles within the ambulance service. He qualified as a Paramedic in 2013 and progressed to Operations Officer at SWAST in 2016. Tim now brings his incident management skills and line management perspective to GWAAC, making sure that both the clinical team's needs and the charity's needs are listened to.
